**REPORTS**

***Animal Control***

Lt. Scheibly distributed copies of their May statistics. June is a busy month for them, they have an antique road show special where everything over three years old is \$25 right now, and all cats and kittens and adult cats are \$25 since they have a surplus. They have had summer camp kids out from the school district the last several days, and they will be doing that a couple more weeks.

Looking at their stats for May for comparison from last month, intakes for April were 177 and they are at 100 above that for May with 276. Calls for service were 150 above where they were the month before. They are in their busy time at the shelter.

Kevin Greenfield asked if they are short any wardens. Lt. Scheibly said they are back to full staff, they have hired two new wardens who are getting trained now, probably by the end of the month they will be on their own, and they will be back to normal activities out there. When those \$25 specials come up, Don Westerman asked if that is a money losing proposition, and do they already have all their shots.

Lt. Scheibly said it is the same, we pay the \$25, then the foundation pays \$25 towards it as well. Don Westerman commented so there isn't any other cost, and Lt. Scheibly said not to the people coming out to adopt since that still is the same, rabies shot, spay and neuter, microchip just like the rest.

Vice Chair McGlaughlin commented that some time ago there was an article in the newspaper about a groundhog and kitten, and has that issue been resolved internally. Lt. Scheibly said it has been resolved internally as far as their process goes, the warden resigned, there are criminal charges pending, but that is all up to the state's attorney's office from this point.

### ***Environmental Management***

Deb Garrett reported on event recycling, it continues to proceed and is getting lots of attention, and this evening they are at the Blues in the Park event and the concert at Fletcher Park in Mt. Zion. They have containers out there, and are monitoring them. They spent a week at the county fair, their containers did, it wasn't as successful as it was last year; there was quite a bit of damage done to their recycling box from someone out there using heavy equipment to move our box, and they are working with Highway to get that repaired. They have events every night of the week some weeks, and are keeping pretty busy with all that.

Vice Chair McGlaughlin asked if the damage was discussed with the Macon County Fair Board, and Deb replied not yet.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

David Williams thought the flood plain remapping issue came through this committee, and he would like to know where we are at on that; he is not sure if it needs to go through Jim Root, EMA, or if it was through Planning & Zoning. He thinks it started in the Regional Planning Commission, then came to this committee, but he hasn't heard anything further. Vice Chair McGlaughlin has not heard anything further either. David Williams had questions today from an individual who is having some surveying done on his property, he was asking where we were at on it, so David will make some calls about it.
